Lifeline (Phone) Program for Low-Income Consumers is a federal government benefit that provides eligible households with a monthly discount on their phone or internet bill. 1-800-234-9473 or www.fcc.gov/general/lifeline-program-low-income-consumers

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) has a pilot program for summer cooling assistance that includes the free installation, repair or replacement of Energy-star rated window air conditioning units or fans. It may also include the repair or replacement of a heat pump or central air conditioning system.

Homeowners or renters who qualified for emergency LIHEAP heating grants or weatherization assistance in 2022-2023 may be eligible. Applicants can contact [Action Housing](http://www.actionhousing.org) (412-281-2102) and ask for a weatherization program application.

LIHEAP and Crisis Grants “...(LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills in the form of a cash grant. Households in immediate danger of being without heat can also qualify for crisis grants. The cash grant is a one-time payment sent directly to the utility company/fuel provider to be credited on your bill. These grants range from \$300 to \$1,000 based on household size, income, and fuel type. Remember: This is a grant and does not have to be repaid.” Call the County Assistance Office (COA) in Allegheny County at 412-565-2146 or visit www.dhs.pa.gov/Services/Assistance/Pages/LIHEAP.aspx

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MATP (Medical Assistance Transportation Program)

“If you live in Allegheny County and are receiving Medicaid, you may be eligible for free public transportation (bus, subway, incline) ahead of time tickets, or reimbursement for your use of public transportation/private vehicle, or free door-to-door service when medically necessary via a shared ride. MATP is required by law to provide the least costly, most appropriate transportation service available.” Click here for application information:
