- LIHEAP may provide help paying heating bills or in a heating emergency
- H2O Help to Others Pa American Water. Includes grant programs, discount programs and water-saving devices and education.
- 3Rivers Proud ALCOSAB Clean Water Assistance Fund (AC Sanitary Authority)
- Anyone seeking assistance with their PWSA (Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority) bill can call Dollar Energy Fund at 1-866-762-2348. PWSA has three major income-based assistance programs:
 - a bill discount program that cuts 75% off the minimum charge for low-income residential customers,
 - the hardship cash assistance program, which helps pay off arrears and,
 - a winter moratorium on shutoffs.Also, learn about lead line replacement assistance.
- **Internet Essentials** from Comcast: Affordable Internet at Home for Eligible Households, low-cost computers and a learning center (a hub for free on line tutorials and in person classes) <https://internetessentials.com/>
- **Lifeline** is a federal government benefit that provides eligible low-income consumers a monthly discount on their phone or internet bill. The benefit can be used for voice (telephone), Broadband Internet Access Service (or BIAS, usually called internet service), or a combined telephone/internet service product from a landline or wireless provider. http://www.puc.pa.gov/Telecom/pdf/Lifeline/Lifeline_Brochure-StayConnected.pdf
- **Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)** Formerly Emergency Broadband Benefit A benefit program that helps households afford internet service through a discount of up to \$30 per month. Eligible households can receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute between \$11 and \$50 toward the purchase price. <https://www.fcc.gov/acp>
